Heads-Up Hold'em is a Texas Hold'em variant.

It is a table game dealt with a single standard 52 card pack. It has a position for the dealer and five player positions. The dealer plays for the house and each player plays against the dealer.

The basic idea is that the player begins by placing an Ante bet and an Odds bet that are equal, and any optional side bets.

The players and the dealer will then receive two cards (pocket cards).

Players may check or make a Raise bet from 1 to 3 times the Ante bet, the dealer then reveals the 3-card flop.

The player who checked previously may then check again or make a Raise bet from 1 to 2 times the Ante, the dealer then reveals the 2-card turn and river.

Lastly, the remaining players who have not raised yet may make a Raise bet equal to the Ante or fold.

The players and the dealer use the five community cards and their two pocket cards to make their best 5-card poker hand.

The dealer then highlights his best five-card hand and the best hand wins; and any side bets are reconciled. The dealer needs a Pair or better to qualify.

THE BETS

The 'ANTE' and the 'ODDS' bets: The player must place an 'Ante' and an 'Odds' bet to receive cards. These bets must be of an equal amount.

The ANTE Bet:

The Ante bet is played against the dealer.

- If the dealer has a better hand than the player's, the Ante bet loses.
- If the dealer does not qualify the Ante bet pushes.
- If the player has a better hand than the dealer's, the Ante bet is paid even money.

The Odds Bet:

The Odds bet must equal the Ante bet and is played against the Dealer.

The Odds bet loses:

- If the Dealer has a better hand than the Player's 'less than a Straight'-hand.

The Odds bet pushes:

- If the Dealer does not qualify and the Player wins with less than a Straight.
- If the Dealer qualifies and the Player wins with less than a Straight.

The Odds bet wins and is paid according to the following 'Odds' pay-odds:

- If the Dealer does not qualify and the Player has a Straight or higher.
- If the Dealer qualifies and the Player wins with a Straight or higher.

The Odds bet wins and is paid according to the following 'Bad beat' pay-odds:

- If the player with a straight or higher loses against the Dealer.

'Odds' bets of a Straight and higher are paid according to the following odds:

'Bad Beat' is paid to the 'Odds' bets, when the player with a Straight or higher loses against the Dealer, according to the following odds:

TABLE OF WIN – BAD BEAT

	WIN	BAD BEAT
Royal Flush	500 to 1
Straight Flush	50 to 1	500 to 1
Four of a kind	10 to 1	25 to 1
Full House	3 to 1	6 to 1
Flush	1.5 to 1	5.1
Straight	1 to 1	4 to 1

The RAISE Bet:

The Raise bet is played against the Dealer.

If the player is satisfied with his hand he may place a Raise bet during one of the three rounds of betting. The earlier he raises, the more he can bet.

Once the player places the Raise bet he may no longer touch his cards or chips.

- If the Dealer has a better hand than the Player's, the Raise bet loses.
- If the Player has a higher hand than the Dealer, regardless if the Dealer qualifies or not, the Raise bet wins and is paid even money.
