

Punto Banco is a combination of the games Chemin de Fer and Baccarat.

The object of the game is to hold cards with a total count nearest to 9. Tens and court cards and any combination of cards with a joint count of ten count as nothing. An ace is counted as one, all other cards have their face value.

Any player may wager with the Bank (BANCO) or against the Bank (PUNTO) at any time prior to the first card being drawn. To wager with the bank, bets must be placed in the numbered box corresponding with the seat number. To wager against the bank, bets must be placed in the PUNTO area immediately in front of the player. Standing players may bet on the BANCO line or on PUNTO. Players may also wager a bet that both hands will have the same total. To make such a bet, the wager must be placed in the EGALITE box.

If both hands have the same total, 'egalite' is declared and the cards are drawn again. Any 'egalite' wagers are paid at odds of 8 to 1.

Winning bets on the player or the bank are paid even money, 1:1, except when the bank wins with a six and then the winning bank bets are paid 0.5:1 (half)

There are no optional draws.
